Welcome (Mr. Verburg)

Mr. Verburg welcomed members in attendance and called the meeting to order. Izzy Wise is out of town.

Principal Update (Mr. Verburg)

An evacuation drill is planned at end of April/first of May. All kids evacuate the school and go to the stadium. The school would like to have pizza and ice cream for the kids. Good News Update (Mr. Verburg)

LHS has two National Merit Finalists – Rosemary Coskrey and Ashley Fellers. Lexington High School had 39 interns this school year working in local businesses; each working 170 hours (or more) with their business, totaling more than 6,630 hours of student engagement in the community and learning college and career ready skills. The National Honor Society raised \$200 in profit from Valentine's chocolate bar sale to donate to the Nancy K. Perry Children's Shelter. Over \$1,400 was raised for Special Olympics of SC and LHS's Project Unify Program through the Polar Plunge event. Student Taylor Doughty won the Coolest Student Award for raising the most individually. LHS students honored at the Columbia Museum of Art February 1 for work they submitted in the Art of Healing Competition. Gabrielle Pepper received a Juror's Choice Award and \$250. Lilliana Cameron received Third Place and \$350. Their art will be on display at the museum during the month of February and then at Lexington Medical Center for the month of March. LHS had two Scholastic Art winners this year at the regional level – Alexandria Lewis won a Gold key and Wallace Mixon won a Silver Key. Alexandria's piece will now be judged on a national level and results will be revealed in March. Coach Molly Goodrich was named Region V-AAAA Coach of the Year.

Teacher Appreciation (Mr. Verburg)

Teacher Appreciation is receiving a lot of positive feedback. Thank you notes and phone calls were made to parents who sent in treats. Next date is March 17th.

FIT Update (Mr. Verburg)

Members brought jelly to the meeting. No other update.
