#### School Extension for At-Risk Students (SEARS)

*From the district's code of conduct: Lexington One's School Extension for At-Risk Students (SEARS) program provides an attendance extension for high school students who receive a final grade of "F" due only to unexcused absences beyond the limit allowed for the course. To participate, the student must otherwise have a passing course grade. Students are allowed to make up no more than two days of unlawful absences per term. Students with excessive absences first term must attend SEARS at the end of the first term. Students with excessive absences second term must attend SEARS at the end of the second term. The cost of the program is \$25 per day.*
