

School Achievements

- Six Lexington High School students were named National Merit Finalists.
- 28 Juniors have been named to 10 Junior Scholar college programs. These students were selected based on their academic merit, leadership, and extra-curricular activities.
- LHS has implemented a new schedule that allows students time during the school day to retake assessments, receive tutoring from teachers, and work collaboratively on projects.
- The LHS broadcasting class created a World Language and International Business video that was used throughout the entire district to promote the LHS center. They also created videos that highlighted World Language week in the month of March and focused on National Student Leadership in the month of April.
- This is the 5th year that the LHS boys soccer team has sponsored the Cats Kick Cancer program. Over the last five years, the Boys Soccer team has raised and donated over \$50,000 to charities dealing with pediatric cancer, including CAMP KEMO and Children's Chance.
- The LHS Director of Counseling was named a ASCA National Semi-Finalist School Counselor of the Year.
- The LHS School Counseling and Advisement Department was awarded the designation of Recognized ASCA Model Program (RAMP). This is a national award given to exceptional school counseling departments.
- LHS was selected to host the Junior Classical League state forum in March.
