Job Search Tips for High School Students

Don't Be Shy. Tell everyone you know you are looking for a job. Many jobs aren't advertised and you may be able to get a good job lead from a friend or family member.

Start Close to Home. One good way to get experience when you are a high school student is to start by working for friends and neighbors. Babysitting yardwork, and pet sitting all can be included on your resume. In addition, the people you work for will be able to give you a reference when you apply for other jobs. This is a good choice if you need to keep up with your studies.

Volunteer. Even though you won't get a paycheck, volunteering is a great way to add experience to your resume which will help you find a paid position in the future. Check with local non-profit organizations for volunteer opportunities or your **Career Specialist**.

Write a Resume. A resume, even though it may not be required by employers, can help you stand out from the competition. Even though you may not have much information to include, a resume shows that you're serious about your job search. See your **Career Specialist** because he or she can help you "fill in" skills you didn't even know you have!

Dress Appropriately. When you are applying in-person for jobs and interviewing, dress appropriately. Use the "Grandma Rule" - if your grandmother would like your interview outfit, you are dressed properly. Here's more on [what to wear to a high school job interview](#) or how to apply for jobs. APPLY ON YOUR OWN (no friends tagging along) with your phone turned OFF and out of sight.

Be Flexible. Be as flexible as possible when it comes to your availability. Also, know when you're available. Bring a list of the hours you can work with you when you apply in person or go an interview.
