Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must be a:

- ✓ South Carolina Resident
- ✓ First-generation college student – defined as a student whose parent(s) have not graduated from an institute of higher education with a four-year degree
- ✓ High school senior or a currently enrolled full-time undergraduate student.

Applicants must submit:

- ✓ An official transcript indicating a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or better
- ✓ Admissions acceptance letter OR college registration documentation indicating full-time enrollment at an accredited four-year U.S. institution for the entire academic year. Unfortunately, students applying to or enrolled at online or proprietary schools are not eligible
- ✓ Two letters of recommendation from a high school/college faculty member, school counselor, employer, or church leader

✓ One letter of affirmation from a parent/guardian stating the applicant is the first person in his/her family to attend college.
