The ASVAB test (also known as the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test) will be administered on Tuesday, April 10 at 9 a.m. at LHS.

This test is available to students in the 10th, 11th, and 12th grade.

ASVAB scores are used to determine if you are qualified to enlist in the military and to assign you to an appropriate job in the military.

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Please follow the procedure outlined below when making applications.

- 1. Decide where you will apply.
- 2. Visit the college's web site. Apply online
- 3. Fill out application completely include appropriate fee (credit card or check made payable to the college).
- 4. Make a request for your counselor to fill out any secondary school report/counselor recommendation form needed for the college to which you are applying. Most of these are done on line so be sure to give the college your counselor's school email address. This is your responsibility to ensure completion of your application.
- 5. Register with Parchment (if you have not done so already). Request a transcript for the college where you are applying. Watch for a confirmation via email from Parchment that your transcript request was completed properly.
- 6. Allow at least 5 school days for your transcript request and all other paperwork to be processed.
- 7. Watch deadlines.
- 8. Register for and take the SAT and/or ACT, if you haven't.
- 9. \$2.00 will be charged for each transcript that Parchment is not able to process if college does not use the electronic system.

REMINDERS

Some colleges require a counselor form (even if you're applying online and even if you're using the Common Application). Be sure to provide your counselor's correct email address when asked.

Ask us if you have questions.

If you have not completed your student resume, please do your best to have it done in the very near future. Counselors or teachers completing a recommendation letter or evaluation form find it helpful. Most adults have a resume, so as a young adult it's important to have your information readily available when completing college and scholarship forms.



COUNSELING PROCEDURES

In any **Counseling and Advisement Department** there must be procedures and organization. We urge you to stay calm, and understand that there is a process in our sending and the colleges receiving transcripts. Planning ahead is key! Submit your request to Parchment well ahead of the deadline. We know the deadlines of the colleges and we do our best to process your transcripts through Parchment and any other paperwork needed in a timely manner. Understand that colleges have their own procedures. With the number of applications they receive allow them a week or two to process them and update your student's account.

- 2. Check the <u>Senior Memo</u> and pay special attention to deadlines. Usually, we must pre-date the scholarship deadline for processing and therefore, the deadline on the Senior Memo is <u>your</u> deadline to submit the application to Counseling.
- 3. Scholarship applications/pre-applications will be available in the file drawer in the Counseling Office. You may access this information without making an appointment with a counselor.
- 4. Take responsibility for watching deadlines and for completing your portion of applications.

What are the skills every 18-year-olds need?

1. An 18-year-old must be able to talk to strangers — faculty, deans, advisers, landlords, store clerks, human resource managers, coworkers, bank tellers, health care providers, bus drivers, mechanics—in the real world.

The crutch: We teach kids not to talk to strangers instead of teaching the more nuanced skill of how to discern the few bad strangers from the mostly good ones. Thus, kids end up not knowing how to approach strangers — respectfully and with eye contact — for the help, guidance, and direction they will need out in the world.

2. An 18-year-old must be able to find his way around a campus, the town in which her summer internship is located, or the city where he is working or studying abroad.

The crutch: We drive or accompany our children everywhere, even when a bus, their bicycle, or their own feet could get them there; thus, kids don't know the route for getting from here to there, how to cope with transportation options and snafus, when and how to fill the car with gas, or how to make and execute transportation plans.

3. An eighteen-year-old must be able to manage his assignments, workload, and deadlines.

The crutch: We remind kids when their homework is due and when to do it—sometimes helping them do it, sometimes doing it for them; thus, kids don't know how to prioritize tasks, manage workload, or meet deadlines, without regular reminders.

4. An 18-year-old must be able to contribute to the running of a house hold.

The crutch: We don't ask them to help much around the house because the check listed childhood leaves little time in the day for anything aside from academic and extracurricular work; thus, kids don't know how to look after their own needs, respect the needs of others, or do their fair share for the good of the whole.

5. An 18-year-old must be able to handle interpersonal problems.

The crutch: We step in to solve misunderstandings and soothe hurt feelings for them; thus, kids don't know how to cope with and resolve conflicts without our intervention.

6. An 18-year-old must be able to cope with ups and downs of courses and workloads, college-level work, competition, tough teachers, bosses, and others.

The crutch: We step in when things get hard, finish the task, extend the deadline, and talk to the adults; thus, kids don't know that in the normal course of life things won't always go their way, and that they'll be okay regardless.

7. An 18-year-old must be able to earn and manage money.

The crutch: They don't hold part-time jobs; they receive money from us for whatever they want or need; thus, kids don't develop a sense of responsibility for completing job tasks, accountability to a boss who doesn't inherently love them, or an appreciation for the cost of things and how to manage money.

8. An 18-year-old must be able to take risks.

The crutch: We've laid out their entire path for them and have avoided all pitfalls or prevented all stumbles for them; thus, kids don't develop the wise understanding that success comes only after trying and failing and trying again (a.k.a. "grit") or the thick skin (a.k.a. "resilience") that comes from coping when things have gone wrong.

Remember: our kids must be able to do all of these things without resorting to calling a parent on the phone. If they're calling us to ask how, they do not have the life skill.
