Parking on campus next school year

State law states that a student cannot miss more than the following number of unexcused days of school and still pass a class. **If they miss more than is allowed the student will receive an "FA". Unexcused absences are coded as UNEX, PN, DSML, OSS. Please check your students powerschool to see if they are over in days.** The breakdown goes as follows. Students cannot have more than:

- more than 5 unexcused absences for a semester class
- More than 3 unexcused absences for a 9 week class
- more than 10 unexcused absences for a year long class

If you student has more that the allowed amount they will need to do SEARS to make up the seat time. SEARS will be on the following dates:

Saturday, June 2 from 7:30 - 11:30

Seniors must make up their seat time by the May 19 date or they will not graduate. Please have your student see Mr. Verburg to create a SEARS contract. SEARS is \$25 per session. Each session allows students to recover up to 4 blocks.
