Students will only be able to purchase parking permits during their ILT or after school from 3:25 p.m. – 4 p.m.

State Law says that students cannot have more than the following number of days unexcused:

9 week class (half the semester) - Can only have 3 unexcused absences

Semester classes - Can only have 5 unexcused absences

Full year classes - Can only have 10 unexcused absences

Unexcused absences will be coded in powerschool as **UNEX, PN, DSML, and OSS**. Please check your students attendance on powerschool to ensure they are not over the allowed unexcused absences. If they are over the allowed unexcused absences they will need to participate in our SEARS program which is on the following Saturdays. Students will not attend all sessions, just up to 2, depending on how many unexcused absences they have:

Saturday, June 1 from 7:30 - 11:30 AM – LHS Little Theater

The cost is \$25 per session and students are only allowed to do 2 SEARS days. If your student needs to do SEARS, please have them come see Mr. Verburg to create a contract. A contract must be made before a student can attend SEARS.
